Short Reflection on Dr. Martin Luther King's Beloved Community: Dr. King's Beloved Community is a global vision, in which all people can share in the wealth of the Earth. In the *Beloved Community*, poverty, hunger, and homelessness will not be tolerated. Racism and all forms of discrimination, bigotry and prejudice will be replaced by an all-inclusive spirit of sisterhood and brotherhood...Love and trust will triumph over fear and hatred. Peace with justice will prevail...

The core value of the quest for Dr. King's *Beloved Community* was agape love...which he described as "understanding, redeeming goodwill for all," an "overflowing love which is purely spontaneous, unmotivated, groundless and creative... the love of God operating in the human heart." He said that "Agape does not begin by discriminating between worthy and unworthy people...It begins by loving others for their sakes" and "makes no distinction between a friend and enemy; it is directed toward both... Agape is love seeking to preserve and create community." (from The King Center, "The King Philosophy")

St. Francis Prayer for Peace
